NONAGENARIAN HONOREES

Celebrations were recently held for ninety-five year old **Murray Brooks** and ninety-four year old **Dr. Donald Schwing**, hosted respectively by **Gerry Sullivan** and **Pam Newton**.

Before moving to LbH in 1978 with his wife **Lorraine**, **Murray** was Principal of a Middle School in New Jersey. Due to his warmth and wonderful stories, I can imagine that it was no hardship for students to be called to the Principal's office. It is not surprising that many former students and staff mem-



bers still keep in touch with **Murray** and **Lorraine**. In his earlier days at LbH **Murray** was an avid fisherman who also found time to contribute to our community as an Association Board member, an Operating Committee member and the Purser and Historian of our Yacht Club for many years. He held the position as chair of the Wood Shop until his recent resignation. Speaking of the Wood Shop, what wonderful creations **Murray** has designed there!! Take a stroll over to D building to see his beautiful wood carving at the entrance. If you ask, you just might be invited to his condo to view the artwork within. While addressing a few remarks to the gathering held in his honor, **Murray** graciously attributed his longevity to his sixty-seven years of marriage to his "wonderful wife **Lorraine**."

Dr. Donald Schwing and his wife **Suzanne** moved to LbH in 1996.

Born in Cincinnati, Ohio, after graduation from Syracuse Medical School in 1948, **Don** continued his career in surgery as the Chief Surgical Resident at Henry Ford Hospital in Detroit. At the gathering, he told some fascinating stories of his deployment to a MASH unit in Korea where he was very influential in saving several lives. After finishing his residency, he was in private practice in Michigan until his retirement one week before his ninetieth birthday. His love for boats subsequently led him to the hobby of boatbuilding which he pursues to this day. When asked about the number of boats **Don** has had, **Suzanne** replied, "He has a barn full of boats." At present he and fellow LbH resident, **Creighton Carroll**, are in the process of creating a sixteen foot wooden runabout. Friends are invited to view their work at the Boat Works off Cortez Road at the end of this month

I first met him at Longboat Harbour woodshop fixing a tiller when he came for his regular walk through to make sure everything was in order in the beloved Woodshop. He was in charge of the woodshop for 35 years, but resigned 2 years ago. I found out that in the 40s he was stationed at Selfridge Air Base just 15 miles north of Grosse Pointe, Michigan where we are

from. I also found out that as a young educator he helped his students build a sailboat that was immediately dismantled after its first launch, which they were able to re-engineer and successfully sail for a period of time.

Murray and his wife of 67 years, Lorraine, have lived in Longboat Harbour since 1978. They have two daughters, four grandchildren, and two great grandchildren with a third on the way.

Always the educator, last October when I disputed his assertion about when daylight savings will end, he simply said “Mr. Momjian, I am sorry this confused you”. A quick search on Google proved him right.

Now to the problem: I was deluded in thinking that we were friends, or had some measure of affection for one another, or at the very least we had a cordial neighborly relationship. Not so as it became clear at the birthday party. I approached Murray and asked him if I could get a hug; he backed away (recoiled is probably a better description) and proclaimed loudly for all to hear, “You are not my type”, but he happily hugged my wife. When I asked him for a selfie later, he reluctantly agreed after telling me that it would cost me fifty cents. I felt dejected, shamed and humiliated. A person can take only so many rejections. Was I delusional? What went wrong? To this day, I have no answer, so I ask you; tell me, was my affection misplaced?



Tiramisu Ristorante & Pizzeria

has been open over a year now and sits behind the DQ in a strip plaza at the corner of 14th Street West and 53rd Avenue West in Bradenton. The dining room is very small but cozy and reservations are highly recommended. Monica, the chef and Luca, her husband, greet you and explain the specialties of the day. Your meal begins with a mixed green salad tossed with a light vinaigrette and served with fresh hot bread. I had the Scaloppina Melanzana (veal scaloppini, mozzarella, fried eggplant and a touch of marinara sauce) which was so delicious, I had it the next time we went with friends. Jim had the Linguine Vongole which is pasta sautéed with baby clams, garlic and olive oil in a white wine sauce. No take home box for this dish. Lasagna Bolognese was another dish totally enjoyed on another visit. Several tables around us were enjoying the Pizza and no one left with boxes. Most of the pasta is made fresh daily except the penne and spaghetti, which requires machinery. The marinara and meat sauces are all made fresh from scratch. A word of advice – a must get is the homemade Tiramisu. You will be thanking me for this recommendation. We have been back several times with different friends and all have enjoyed their meals. Operating Committee December 8, 2015

- On Dec. 21, the removal of Australian pines will begin and will take about 4 days to complete.
- Plans are in the works for a new bike shed at the beginning of Falmouth.
- All bike sheds will be cleaned on the last working day of each month.
- Starting in 2017, bike spaces will be chosen by lottery.
- Options are being explored for lights under carports.
- Work at the beach house is progressing. Next project will be the plumbing. When all else is done, pavers will be steam cleaned.
- Motion passed to employ the Spectra company (\$19,100.00) to install carpets in Rec Hall, Game Room and Locker Rooms. This will go to the next BOD meeting for approval. OC members will make recommendation to the Board re colors.
- Bill Coughlin commented that the California drain and carports are very messy. OC will look into purchasing some special equipment to clean these areas better. He also asked about the lines above pools to keep out birds and mentioned that the light is not working in the pool near building E.
- Dennis brought up the issue of a job description for Building Reps.
- Jim Fox said that the raccoons are still with us. He saw one on the second floor of H building. Dennis will speak with our exterminator.
- Roofing - mansards have been prepped but work has been stalled because a "starter set" does not fit properly.
- New kayak racks will provide space for 8 more kayaks.

December BOD meeting and OC meetings were cancelled.

Operating Committee January 2016

- 7 raccoons trapped and sent to Mayaka State Park.

- 22 Australian pines removed from property near kayak racks.
- Completed renovation of beach house bathrooms – painting of building and pressure washing of pavers to follow.
- Motion passed to obtain estimates, not to exceed \$2,000.00, to purchase new vinyl fence to be installed near the gym by our staff.
- T1 line from Verizon installed with an annual savings of \$2,400.00.
- Decision made to clean saunas and put them in operational order.
- Motion passed to spend up to \$2,600.00 on engineering plans for a double bike shed on Falmouth Drive at curve of Chatham and Falmouth Drives across from D building.
- Motion passed to engage Delta Engineering to devise a plan for painting and mansard replacement of resident buildings. Plan not to exceed \$6,000.00.
- Plan to hire new person for maintenance staff.
- Roofs in process of installation on common buildings are guaranteed for 50 years.
- IT professional has been hired to work on our computer systems.
- Motion regarding installation of new carpets in the billiard room, locker rooms and gym areas was tabled pending presentation of a more detailed cost breakdown by the Operating Committee chair.
- Motion to install tile in all elevators – tabled pending further discussion.
- Reply to resident that locks have been removed from storage areas – safety issue by Fire Marshall.
- Plans are being discussed to install some type of lighting in the carports.
- Job descriptions will be sent to all building reps.
